A regular meeting of the Breckenridge Village Council was called to order at 7:00 pm by President Seeley at the Village Hall. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Roll Call was taken by Manager Ostrander.

-Motion by Councilperson Wingle and seconded by Councilperson Baldwin to approve the agenda as presented. CARRIED.

-Motion by Clapp and seconded by Councilperson Wingle to approve the consent agenda. Roll Call Vote: Yeas: Burt, Clapp, Baldwin, Fitzgerald, Wingle, Seeley. Nays: None CARRIED.

Committee/Board Reports were received.

-Ray Rohn – Complaint about catch basins not maintained. The DPW is not doing their job.

-Pat Rohn – Complaint about water in her backyard. She never had this issue until the village made improvements to the water and storm sewer systems.

-Motioned by Councilperson Burt, seconded by Councilperson Wingle to approve the resolution adopting the Gratiot Countywide Master Plan in its entirety as Breckenridge's Master Plan. Roll Call Vote: Yeas: Baldwin, Fitzgerald, Wingle, Burt, Clapp, Seeley. Nays: None CARRIED.

-Motioned by Councilperson Fitzgerald, seconded by Councilperson Baldwin to approve the purchase of a 2027 International HV607 plow truck and additional outfitting equipment as presented. Total cost is \$166,221.79. Roll Call Vote: Yeas: Fitzgerald, Wingle, Burt, Clapp, Baldwin, Seeley. Nays: None CARRIED.

-Pat Rohn – asked if we decided on a mural for the wall we plan to paint? She did not like the one that had all male athletes.

-Scott Guthrie – wanted a police report from the county and was very upset when we could not produce one.

-Tim Schaub – asked if the truck purchase had been part of the CIP for at least 5 years.

-Pat Rohn – wants something done about the cars running stop signs at her intersection. She claims 50% of cars do not stop.
